

Barclays FA Women's Super League: 10-year anniversary

- April 13th this year marks 10 years since the first ever matches in the FA Women's Super League in the two games played on April 13th, 2011, there were two 1-0 away wins for Arsenal against Chelsea and Doncaster Belles against Lincoln City. Opta looks back over the 10 years of the WSL and explores all the players, managers, teams, goals and much more to give a comprehensive overview of the top-flight of the English women's game.
- There have been 784 matches in the WSL to date, with the home and away wins a near direct split 325 at home and 314 away.

o The biggest margin of victory in the history of the WSL was Arsenal's 11-1 win over Bristol City in December 2019. It remains the only time a team has scored double figures in a FA Women's Super League match. Arsenal, Chelsea and Liverpool are the only three teams to win a game by 8+ goals, doing so on seven occasions between them.

• The player with the best win ratio in WSL history – among players with at least 20 appearances – is Arsenal's Viktoria Schnaderbeck, with the Austrian winning 18 of her 21 games (85.7%), marginally higher than Daphne Corboz, who won 17 of her 20 games with Man City. Schnaderbeck also has the record for the longest winning run from the start of a WSL career, ending on the winning side in her first 12 appearances.

The best-ever unbeaten run by a player is 52 matches, with Maren Mjelde achieving this spectacular feat between May 2017 and January 2021 for Chelsea. In the game to end her run she was a substitute, playing 22 minutes against Brighton, meaning the only game she has only started and lost in the WSL was back in May 2017, when she played the full 90 minutes of a 1-0 Chelsea defeat to Man City. Her team-mate Millie Bright is on an ongoing run of 44 games unbeaten – since featuring in a 5-0 home defeat to Arsenal in 2018, she hasn't lost a single match.
